- Must be between 1000-2000 words, double-spaced, typed pages, including all text, tables, graphics and appendices

### Paper Submittals

- All entries must include your name, address, e-mail, telephone number, college/university, major, number of units currently enrolled and ITE Membership Form (only if you're not a student member)
- Submittals must include all support materials, if appropriate, and can be electronic (.PDF and Word) or hard copy.
- The winning papers will be chosen on or before April 13, 2007. The entries will be judged based on content, clarity, style and creativity. Winners must attend and present the "Winning Paper" at the April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2007 ITE San Francisco Bay Area Section.
